INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE & STRATEGY

The Fund seeks long-term capital growth through an actively managed portfolio of international stocks. The Fund's investment process focuses on security selection and portfolio construction. The Adviser's goal is to construct a diversified portfolio of reasonably valued stocks of higher quality companies.

Security Selection

The Adviser seeks to identify and invest in companies that exhibit higher quality business and financial characteristics. The Adviser considers higher quality companies to be those judged to have financial stability, prudent capital management, and financial statements that indicate economic success. Using both quantitative and qualitative assessments, the Adviser seeks to highlight firms for investment primarily on the basis of business stability, profitability, balance sheet sustainability, accounting practices, and growth opportunities. The goal is to identify companies that exhibit a quality profile judged by the Adviser to be desirable relative to the universe and each company's sector and country peers.

Portfolio Construction

The Fund's primary consideration is investing in higher quality companies that meet Boston Trust Walden's established ESG guidelines. The Fund's investments, in aggregate, possess portfolio characteristics the Adviser judges to be superior to those of international developed markets. The Fund is broadly diversified across economic sectors, countries, and currencies with weightings generally comparable to those of the international developed markets. The Fund's holdings, in aggregate, will have valuation characteristics that are, in the Adviser's judgment, comparable or better than those of an international developed market proxy.

Environmental, Social, and Governance Guidelines


As part of the investment decision-making process for the Fund, the Adviser evaluates how financially material environmental, social, and governance (ESG) risks and opportunities may affect a company's revenues, expenses, assets, liabilities, and overall risk. The consideration of ESG risks and opportunities in investment decision-making is referred to as "ESG integration." The Adviser considers "financial materiality" as it is understood in Generally Accepted Accounting Principles - information that would influence the judgment of an informed investor. The integration of ESG risks and opportunities is often a subjective exercise and may differ depending on the characteristics of the asset class. Active ownership activities include proxy voting, company engagement, shareholder resolutions, and public policy advocacy. While the Adviser integrates ESG risks and opportunities into its investment decision-making, the Fund is also subject to ESG screening criteria. ESG screening criteria require the Adviser to exclude companies with significant exposure to specific products or services: alcohol production, coal mining, factory farming operations, gambling, handguns, nuclear power fuel cycle, prison operations, tobacco manufacturing, and weapons systems.

ABOUT THE ADVISER

Boston Trust Walden Inc. (the "Adviser") is the investment adviser of the Fund and a wholly-owned operating subsidiary of Boston Trust Walden Company ("Boston Trust Walden"), a Massachusetts chartered bank and trust company. Boston Trust Walden is an independent, employee-owned firm providing investment management services to institutional investors and private wealth clients. Boston Trust Walden manages approximately \$16.6 billion in assets and employs a staff of 95, including 41 investment professionals averaging 11 years with the firm and 23 years in the industry.

FUND RISKS

The Fund invests in foreign securities which involve political, economic and currency risks, greater volatility and differences in accounting methods. The Adviser votes proxies in a manner it believes is consistent with the Fund's long-term investment focus. Such votes may not always be consistent with maximizing short-term performance of the issuer. The Fund's ESG screening criteria may influence the Fund's exposure to certain companies, sectors, and/or industries, which may adversely affect the Fund's performance depending on how such companies, sectors, and/or industries are performing relative to the market. In addition, the Fund may gain indirect exposure to businesses or activities inconsistent with the Fund's ESG-related criteria in a variety of ways, including one company's investments, joint ventures, etc.
